

School Fees

An invoice for school fees is enclosed. If you have not done so, please consider signing up for School Cash Online. By signing up you will receive an email notification whenever something is available for you to purchase for one or all of your children. This includes school fees, concession credit, hot lunches etc. It is our hope that the majority of our families will take advantage of this quick, secure and easy alternative to sending cash and cheques to the school. Transporting Students

As we know, at this time transporting students is not allowed, however we ask that you please consider completing the Volunteer Driver Authorization Form as well as all other required documents. The form and check list are attached. Completing these requirements will allow us to be prepared in the event that restrictions change in the future.

Parking

Parking stalls are available along the east and west sides of the school and should be utilized. Parking in front of the school is not permitted from 8:00-9:00 a.m. and 2:30-3:30 p.m. to allow busses proper access to the school. Everyone is asked to comply with the posted parking signs for student safety.

At this time we do not have Safety Patrollers. Parents and students are asked to cross the street at the corner only, again for student safety.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

On Tuesday, Oct. 1, 2019, starting at 1:45pm, students will be taking part in the annual **Terry Fox School Run**. Our fundraising goal this year is **\$3500.00**, which is a goal of roughly **\$40 per student**, in honour of this being the **40th** year of the Terry Fox Run.

We are also proud to announce that this is **St. Michael School's 25th year** being involved in the run. Through our participation in the Terry Fox School Run, we have donated tens of thousands of dollars to support cancer research and hope to encourage leadership in our students and create positive agents of change in our wonderful school community. If our students reach our goal of **\$40** for **40** years, they will then earn **25** minutes (of outside free time) in honour of our **25** years of involvement. The student who raises the most, will receive a **\$25** credit at the concession (this could also be divided up amongst a family).

To remain in compliance with provincial health guidelines and maintain social distancing, we are encouraging online donating only. Online donating is safe, fast and easy. Donations are receipted immediately by email. There is no minimum donation for online donations – every dollar counts! Please read the back of this page for more information.

The run itself will look slightly different than past years in that we will walk in school cohorts (grades) instead of school families and our pre-walk assembly will be held outside by the basketball hoops. We will still be escorted by police and we still invite family members to join us to walk, as long as those family members stay with their own children. Post-walk we will not be gathering at all and students will go directly to their block 8 classes.

Work Experience

Work Experience is a program designed to create an opportunity for students to earn high school credits and experience the World of Work first hand. Students may be in a paid or a volunteer position. Students can earn up to 15 credits towards their High School Diploma. All students **must have** complete the **HCS 3000 (Workplace Safety Systems) course** before starting work experience and complete the Off-Campus Work Agreement form and return it **BEFORE** hours of work will start to be accumulated. Students are responsible for finding their own positions.

Earn while you learn!



Green Certificate Program

This program is a joint endeavor between Alberta Education and Alberta Agriculture and Forestry. Participants learn by actively performing the skills required under the direction of experienced farm personal and provides students with credentials that could lead to a career in agribusiness. Students must complete AGR3000 (an Agriculture Safety course). Students can earn up to 16 credits towards their High School Diploma. There are 14 different specializations to choose from. Go to : https:// lethbridgecollege.ca/greencertificate to see all 14 and their description's.



Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP)

This program provides senior high school students the opportunity to earn credits in high school and gain on-the-job training that can be applied towards an apprenticeship. Students can earn up to 40 credits towards their High School Diploma. All students must have complete the HCS 3000 (Workplace Safety Systems) course before starting RAP and be paid at least minimum wage for their work. RAP students will also receive their Apprenticeship Blue Book.

NOTICE RE: INSURANCE COVERAGE

VOLUNTEER DRIVERS:

Those wishing to act as volunteer drivers for school division activities and who are planning to use their own vehicle would be well-advised to inform their insurance company.

With regard to insurance coverage, the school division insurance policies have been endorsed to provide excess liability insurance for volunteer drivers. At the present time, the maximum excess amount is \$9,000,000. However, the school division's insurance does not come into force unless there is a claim in excess of the liability limits in the owner's insurance policy (e.g., if the volunteer driver's insurance limit was \$200,000 – which is required by law – and there is a judgment of \$400,000, the driver's insurance would cover \$200,000 and the school division's excess liability insurance would cover the remaining \$200,000. Damage to the owner's vehicle is NOT insured by the Holy Spirit Roman Catholic Separate Regional Division No. 4.

School division excess liability only applies when no payment has been made for the use of a private vehicle (e.g., gas, mileage, etc.). When payment is made for the use of a private vehicle it is incumbent upon the owner of the vehicle to arrange for proper and adequate insurance through his own insurer.

If you are doing a lot of volunteer driving for school, sporting or church activities, etc., we would suggest that you review your insurance limits with your agent to ensure that you are adequately protected.

Notes to the Application on other side:

Note #1: Applications can be approved only when the driver possesses a valid driver's

license and is able to respond "no" to questions concerning convictions and

suspensions.

Note #2: The owner of the vehicle is expected to inform his/her insurance agent of the

intention to use the automobile and to act as a driver for school board

activities. The majority of insurance companies do not require an

endorsement to auto policies or an additional premium charge because this

driving is classified as occasional and is not done for compensation.

Note #3: It is required by the division that volunteer drivers carry a minimum

\$2,000,000 personal liability limit.

News Release from Community Health (Lethbridge)

Parents please be advised: A child who is under the age of six years and whose weight does not exceed 18 kg (40 lbs) must be properly secured in a child safety seat. This does not include a booster seat. (Approved booster seats may be used once the child is six years of age or weighs more than 18 kg (40 lbs).
