Communication

School-based messages come from many different sources. Please review the following information to ensure you are receiving information in the most efficient and timely manner.

District Level Communications

Possible Subjects:

- COVID mandates from Alberta Ed
- Other messages from the Superintendent

- Bus cancellations* etc





Available through:

- **Default email**. If you do nothing to specifically request a means of communication, messages will be sent to the email provided on student registration.
- **School messenger App.** Allows you to set preferences by email, text or or calls. Please see attached insert to set up or check on your settings. It is possible that you may have blocked or unsubscribed to these types of communications (intentionally during the COVID rush or accidentally) so it is good to double-check these settings on your own account to be sure you have all the up to date info.
- Websites <u>www.holyspirit.ab.ca</u> or <u>www.holyspirit.ab.ca/smbi</u>
- *Prairie Rose handles bussing routes and cancellations so they will generate an **automated phone notification** the morning of an emergency closure.
- If you think you may not be receiving important information please call the school and we can investigate further with \head office.


Available through:

- **Email**. If you have not received a digital copy of this month's newsletter please be sure to investigate further by calling the school. An email address may be typed incorrectly to the master list or you may have unintentionally blocked the sender, in which case we can easily reverse this. Please call the school.
- **Postal service. In September, the first Welcome newsletter of the year is mailed out to each family. In February, registration packages are mailed out as well.
- ***Student absences are automatically generated when a teacher enters an absence code in our attendance system. An **automatically-generated phone call** is sent around 9am if we haven't heard from parents by then explaining the absence. The school will try to call parents before the auto-message is sent, which will then cancel it.
- **Possibly Social Media.** Our school social media accounts (Facebook <u>St. Michael's School, BI</u> and Twitter <u>@SMBISchool</u> were created to primarily celebrate successes. We recognize they are widely used and seen by many but we do not rely solely on this for urgent or important information.

Classroom Level Communication

Improving Our Schools' Communication with Home!

Holy Spirit Catholic School Division has contracted with SchoolMessenger to improve our schools' communication with parents and guardians.

This service does not replace other school communication methods. It is simply intended to extend beyond what we've traditionally used to ensure timely communications and reduce the amount of papers being sent home. Principals and teachers will still be available for face to face meetings and some paper notices may still be sent home occasionally.

In the meantime, we're excited to announce that two new methods of communicating with our students' families using SchoolMessenger have been launched!

Text (SMS) Messaging

1) Did you receive a text from us?

When a new mobile number is entered by the school, within 24 hours, a text should be sent to that number asking if you would like to subscribe.

Simply respond with your preference:

- Type "Y" or "Yes" to receive messages by text.
- Type "N" or "Stop" if you'd prefer not to receive messages by text. You can do this to unsubscribe at any time.
- 2) You haven't received a text and you'd like to? You can always subscribe to receive texts from the school by sending a "Y" to 978338. You will receive a notification that your opt-in is complete if successful.



3) Do you have a new or different device you'd like to receive texts to?

First, make sure your child's school has this new number in their system! You should receive

a message in 24 hours asking you to respond with a "Y." If you don't, send a "Y" directly to **978338.** You will receive a notification that your opt-in is complete if successful.

*While this service is free, standard message and data rates may apply. Please check with your device's data provider if you have any questions related to charges.






SchoolMessenger App


The School Messenger App allows parents to:

- Access important school notifications 24/7/365
- Set your communications preferences for calls, emails, texts, and more
- Receive all kinds of school messages in one single app (classroom and group updates, activity alerts, school and division notifications)
- Review your messages on any device (smartphone, laptop, etc...)



Go to the GooglePlay or Apple Stores to download "SchoolMessenger" (the version with the blue logo).

You can also download the app, or set up your account, from http://go.schoolmessenger.com.




Make sure you enter the email address that the school has on file for you. This will allow the app to find all of the students associated with you. Also, make sure you select "Canada" as your location.

3) Set your preferences:

When you first log in, click on the licon in the upper left corner of your screen and select "Preferences." For each category, you can select how you would like to be notified:

- School Hours Emergency For urgent messaging during school hours
- Non-School Hours Emergency For urgent messaging before and after school hours
- Attendance For calls regarding your child's attendance.
- General Day to day information from the school.




4) Enable push notifications:

Even if you turn off most types of notifications (phone, text, email), you can still receive those messages through push notifications on your phone.

To set your push notifications, click on the icon in the upper left corner of your screen. Select "Settings," then "Push Notifications."


Click on all of those boxes for which you would like to receive push notifications on your device.

SHIRING AREAS SIMBLE

ST. MICHAEL

This month brings us to a different kind of saint as we turn our attention to the holy archangels. St. Michael is the leader of all angels and of the army of God. This is what the title "Archangel" means, that he is above all the others in rank. St. Michael has four main responsibilities or offices, as we know from scripture and Christian tradition: 1) to fight against Satan, 2) to rescue the souls of the faithful from the Devil, especially at the hour of death, 3) to attend the dying and accompany them to judgment, and 4) to be the champion of God's people; the Israelites under the Old Law, and now the Catholic Church.

Explanation and Hierarchy of the 9 Choirs of Angels

1ST TRIAD - CONTEMPLATE AND ADORE GOD DIRECTLY


SERAPHIM (meaning "the burning ones"). They are attendants at the throne of God. They praise God singing, "Holy Holy Holy is the Lord of Hosts!" - ISAIAH 6:1-7



CHERUBIM (meaning "the fullness of wisdom").
They contemplate God's providence, and are assigned to protect special places.

- EXODUS 25:18-21; EZEKIEL 10:14; REVELATIONS 4-6

THRONES represent the steadfastness of the love of God. They contemplate God's love and judgment, and they appear as the most unlike the others when revealed.





2ND TRIAD - FULFILL GOD'S PLAN IN THE UNIVERSE



DOMINIONS are lord over the lower choirs and humanity. They take illumination from the higher hierarchies and govern the universe.

VIRTUES run the operation of movement in the universe. They are often associated with planets, elements, seasons, and nature. - EPHESIANS 1:21



POWERS assist in governing the natural order. They are warrior angels tasked with fighting the war against the demonic choirs. - EPHESIANS 3:10; 6:12






