Dear Parents,

We are pleased to be able to offer school swimming sessions to our students in Grades K-12 at the local Bow Island Swimming Pool, starting June 6th. These sessions align well with the Program of Studies for Physical Education. Different classes will be combined to swim on different days so please see the attached schedule to ensure your child is prepared for the day their group will be swimming.

Grades K-6 will be participating in lessons this year. These will be led by the Bow Island lifeguards. Other swim sessions will be directed by your child's Phys Ed teacher and supervised by the Bow Island lifeguards. There is no cost to your child for this activity. The lifeguards will determine the areas of the pool your child is able to swim in based on ability. Students will be required to swim a test lane to go in the deep end if lessons are not occuring. Life jackets are also available.

We will be walking to the pool and parents are always welcome to join, and/or come and watch at your leisure. Students not participating for any reason will join the group and sit on the bleachers with a supervisor while the class swims. Items to remember:

- swim suit
- towel
- plastic bag for wet clothes
- Optional: goggles, sunscreen, shampoo/conditioner

RE: Student Attendance During Final Exams

Dear Parents & Guardians,

Friday June 16, 2023 is the last day of regular classes for grades 7 -12 at St. Michael's School. The exam schedule commences June 19th and continues until June 27th. Regular classes for grades 7-12 classes will not run during the exam schedule and students will not be under teacher supervision after the completion of their exams. Students are to leave the school after the completion of their exams, however there will be a supervised study room available for students who require bussing to get home. Regular classes for elementary (K-6) will continue according to the usual schedule.

Students in grades 7-9 are required to write all core class exams regardless of their course grades. This ensures student responsibility regarding the use of the time provided for studying during exam week, and also, the collection of meaningful assessment data for core course teachers.

All exams begin at 8:45am. Please be diligent in ensuring students arrive on time for exams as late entries often cause significant disruption to students already writing and important writing details are communicated at the beginning of every exam. Students will not receive extended time when they have arrived late to an exam. Please refer to the exam schedule for dates each subject is being written.

Students who miss an exam will not be permitted to rewrite the exam unless they have communicated to their teacher the nature of the absence prior to the exam. In cases of emergency circumstances, school administration will intervene on behalf of the student to ensure a reasonable solution. The exam make-up day is only for students who have rescheduled exams prior to exam week. Students who do not communicate the need for a rescheduled exam in advance, will not be permitted to write on the exam make-up day. Diploma and PAT exam dates are mandated by Alberta Education and may not be changed for any circumstance. Students who are absent for a diploma exam, may write it during the next designated date in the following semester. Students who are absent for a PAT may not write the exam at another time.

Exams can bring extra stress upon students. While the school staff works faithfully to prepare students for exams, parents and guardians ought to ensure that students are studying, getting enough sleep, and managing stress. Please contact the school's counselling services for support regarding strategies parents can utilize for students during exams.

What can families enrolling their child in Trinity High School expect?

Trinity teachers support students individually as they learn through distributed learning modules.

Trinity offers students a small, caring, understanding and welcoming school environment where students are accepted, encouraged and treated with dignity.

Less formal and structured than a traditional school. Individual learning plans are developed with student, caregivers and school.

Who would be the ideal learner to attend the Trinity 10-12 alternative program?

Students who enjoy and excel learning independently.

Students who due to work or sports commitments need the flexibility in their timetable. Students who have difficulty attending school due to mental health conditions, such as anxiety or depression.

Students who have had gaps in attendance through the pandemic and have had a hard time re-engaging in school.

Students who have had difficulty socially engaging with peers, or who feel overwhelmed by large numbers of students in traditional classrooms and schools.

RAP

Registered Apprenticeship Program

RAP is an opportunity for high school students to earn up to 40 credits towards their high school diploma while counting hours towards their first year apprenticeship in one of Alberta's trades.

The students who have made career choices and commitments to RAP begin their training in any one of the apprenticeship trades while in high school. They spend part of the year in school completing graduation requirements and part in industry as a registered apprentice.

Green Certificate

The Green Certificate Program is an apprenticeship - style program that allows students, who live and work in agriculture, the opportunity to earn credits toward their high school diploma.

Students will have the opportunity to obtain an industry recognized certificate from Alberta Agriculture. Students learn on the job, under the direction of experienced farm personnel and under the supervision and administration of Alberta Agriculture ,Forestry (AF), and Alberta Education.

Special Projects

Special Project students become involved in supervised selection, planning, and organization of their own programs which is NOT within the scope of the regular curriculum.

Pilgrims of Hope

Saint Maximilian Kolbe 1894-1941 (Feast Day: August 14)

Raymund Kolbe was born in Poland in 1894. At the age of 12, while praying with an image of Our Lady of Czestochowa, Mary appeared to him in a vision. He later joined a branch of the Franciscan order, and took the name Maximilian as his religious name when he was ordained. In the early 1930s, he served as a missionary in Shanghai, Nagasaki, and Malabar. The monastery which he built in his time in Nagasaki later survived the atomic bomb blast.

Kolbe returned to Poland in 1936, resumed his work as a priest and publisher, and started a Catholic radio station. At the outbreak of the Second World War in 1939, Kolbe and his fellow friars provided shelter to Jewish refugees, and continued publishing Catholic and anti-Nazi works. Kolbe was arrested in February 1941, and was eventually sent to Auschwitz. He maintained his priestly ministry in the camp, which led to beatings and punishments.

In late July 1941, after the escape of a prisoner from the camp, ten men were selected to be starved to death as punishment. One of the men selected was a Polish army sergeant named Franciszek Gajowniczek; when selected, he cried out for his wife and family. At this point, Kolbe stepped forward to take his place voluntarily. Gajowniczek survived the war and lived until 1996.

The prisoners were jailed in an underground bunker and deprived of food and water. During this time, Kolbe led the group in prayer. After two weeks, only Kolbe and three others remained alive. On August 14, 1941, he and the other three prisoners were killed with a lethal injection.



Holy Moments In Our Schools

Over the course of this year, we have been blessed to see the many Holy Moments that have happened throughout Holy Spirit. When we take time to step back and reflect on these moments, we often discern the role that the Holy Spirit plays in our lives to reveal God and his plan to us. As you have each taken up the call to Arise this year, like the École St. Mary students shown here, you too have been a conduit for the Holy Spirit for those around you.

June – Comfort the Afflicted

Comforting the afflicted (or sometimes, the sorrowful), is the last of the Spiritual Works of Mercy that we will examine this year. This comfort is not a corporal (physical) work of mercy because it is describing the need that we have to support one another emotionally and spiritually. If we consider the roots of the word comfort, we find together (com-) and strong (-fort); strong together. We see something similar in the word compassion—suffering together. When we find ways to suffer with one another—to bear each other's burdens—we become stronger and more unified. That strength and unity is modeled in a perfect way in Christ, who took on all of our burdens and suffered for us, that we might become one. "It is not a sign of weakness to share your suffering with someone. In fact, it takes great courage and it takes even more courage to listen and not try to solve the problem. Sometimes we just need to "suffer with" that person in order to comfort them."

Be open to listening and comforting those who are dealing with grief. Even if we aren't sure of the right words to say, our presence can make a big difference.

- Lend a listening ear to those going through a tough time
- Make a home cooked meal for a friend who is facing a difficult time
- Write a letter or send a card to someone who is suffering
- A few moments of your day may make a lifetime of difference to someone who is going through a difficult time

The Fruit of the Spirit – Love

Love is both a Fruit of the Spirit and one of the three *Theological Virtues* inspired by the Holy Spirit. As the first and greatest *Theological Virtue*, Love (or Charity) refers to our ability to love God above all things, and our neighbour as ourself. Our imperfect love is a reflection of the perfect love that God has for us, and the love that exists in the relationship between God, Christ, and the Holy Spirit. This points us toward the idea that love is relational, and the fullness of love leads us into communion and spiritual unity with God and one another. Throughout this year, we have focused on this element of Mark 5 of the Catholic School Identity - that we live in community, spiritual unity, and relationship.

God demonstrates His perfect, selfless, agape love to a world that is often confused about what true love is. In society, we have overused the word 'love' in ways that minimize the depth of what real love is. We say we "loved the movie" or we "loved those blueberry pancakes" or we "love" a Facebook post.

Jesus used the word 'love' 51 times during his teaching. In John 15:17, he used the word 'love' in a command, "These things I command you, that you love one another." As a child of God, we need to strive to show others God's love through us. Whether it be reaching out to a friend in need, volunteering in a mission, giving our time to a cause—reach out in love, and let the fruit of love ripen inside your spirit.

Reflecting on the life of St. Maximilian Kolbe ...

Saint Maximilian Kolbe Showed "Comfort the Afflicted"

As we have seen, we can draw a connection between comforting the afflicted and suffering together. In his final days, St. Maximilian Kolbe chose to suffer together with his fellow prisoners, and continued to point them towards Christ even in their unimaginable circumstances. In his collected writings, he once said:

"A person is great and becomes a witness and a teacher, capable of leaving an authentic message to the world, not so much on account of what one says or writes, but for what one is..."

Although St. Maximilian Kolbe died at Auschwitz, he left an authentic message to the world. The man he saved, Franciszek Gajowniczek, survived the remainder of the war and was reunited with his wife, and spent his life spreading the story of Kolbe's sacrifice.

St. Maximilian Kolbe, Pray for us!

Saint Maximilian Kolbe Showed "Love"

When St. Maximilian Kolbe was canonized by St. Pope John Paul II, he was decreed to be a martyr of charity. In the Catholic tradition, this is someone who is martyred in the act of practicing charity motivated by faith. In this alone, it is clear that Kolbe was a model of love.

One saying that was often repeated by Kolbe in his life and work was "only Love creates." The meaning of this, so evident not only in World War II but also in our own day, is that hatred is not a creative force - all that is created is a reflection of the love that God has for us. In the crucible of Auschwitz, founded in hatred, Kolbe chose to witness his faith by laying down his life for a man that he did not know. Such a decision could only be made in the knowledge that this loving choice would have creative ends in God's plan. As St. Pope John Paul II said at his canonization:

"And in this human death of his there was the clear witness borne to Christ: the witness borne in Christ to the dignity of man, to the sanctity of his life, and to the saving power of death in which the power of love is made manifest."

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Gospel Reading: John 3:16-18

"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." — John 3:16

What is the most precious thing you have? Is it a special toy? A special friendship? A special talent? Would you be willing to give it to someone else if that person needed it? There is nothing more precious than life itself. But God was willing to send Jesus into our world for our benefit.

On this special feast day, we remember that while God is one, God is also a family of three Persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit, bound together as one by a great force of love. The amazing thing is that Father, Son and Holy Spirit love us with the same great love. There is nothing more important to God than to bring us into their family of love.

Dear Lord, thank you for loving us with such a great love that even death cannot separate us. Help us to sacrifice the little things we hold onto so we can imitate your love to others and bring them closer to you.

What is one thing you can give up today that will help someone else?

June 11, 2023

Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

Gospel Reading: John 6:51-58

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." — John 6:56

What happens when you dissolve a powdered drink mix in water and shake it up? Would it be possible to separate the granules from the water once they are completely dissolved? Of course not! Our Gospel passage today reminds us that when we receive Jesus' Body and Blood in Holy Communion, he becomes a part of us, and we are changed to become more like him. Last week, we learned that God's love for us is so great that Christ was willing to die so we might be brought into the family of God. This week, we see that not only do we become a part of God's family through Jesus' death and resurrection, but Jesus went even a step further by providing a way for us to have his Body and Blood poured into us. He wants so much to be a part of us that he gives us himself in this new way. We are blessed to have an opportunity to receive him in Holy Communion.

Thank you, Jesus, for offering us your Body and Blood so that your life can become our life. Help us to prepare well to receive you in Holy Communion so we will welcome you with a clean heart.

What will you say to Jesus after receiving him in Holy Communion today? (For those who have not yet received their First Holy Communion, you can still talk to him in prayer during the communion procession.)

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gospel Reading: Matthew 9:36-10:8

"Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

— Matthew 10:8

Have you even received advertising mail that contained a quarter or even a dollar? The advertiser usually suggests that you donate the money back to their cause. I wonder how many people do that. I think most people feel that since they didn't ask for the money, and the advertiser chose to give it to them, they don't owe the advertiser anything back.

In today's Gospel, Jesus called his apostles by name and gave them a very important opportunity—not because they did something to earn it, but because he believed they would use the opportunity to help others believe that God loves them. Jesus told them to go out into the world and tell God's people about the kingdom he prepared for them. Even more than telling them, they were to show them how it works in this kingdom of his. How? By taking care of them for free. They cured their illnesses, brought the dead back to life, and drove out evil spirits. Many people came to believe in Jesus because of the generous acts of his apostles.

Dear Lord, help us to be so generous as to share your love with others, not for what we will get in return but because we want to return what you have given us—your love.

What is one thing you can do to help people know that God loves them?

June 25, 2023

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gospel Reading: Matthew 10:26-33

"What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops." — Matthew 10:27

Have you ever had a dream that seemed so real that when you awoke you thought the events had actually happened? Many times in the Bible we read that God spoke to people in dreams. God can also speak to us in other ways besides dreams. The Gospel today says that God may sometimes speak to us quietly. If we suddenly have a sense that we should or shouldn't do something, God may be prompting us to do the right thing. Or, if we are reading a story and all-of-a-sudden it reminds us of someone who needs our help, God may be asking us to share God's love with that person. The key to hearing God is to listen carefully. We cannot tell others what God has told us if we didn't hear him, can we?

Lord Jesus, open my eyes so I may see clearly; open my ears so I may hear you and help others to know you.

After Mass today, take a few moments together to sit silently and listen. What do you hear? Is it hard not to talk, just to sit quietly? It may take some practice, but it's worth the effort if it helps us to hear God's voice.


